

Putin vows to crush uprising

President Vladimir Putin has vowed to crush an armed mutiny after Wagner Group chief Yevgeny Prigozhin seized control of military sites in an attempt to oust Russia's military leadership



Yevgeny Prigozhin:

Accuses Russia's military leadership of killing large number of his fighters in air strike in Ukraine. Demands to meet with defence minister

Moscow: Security tightened, armed vehicles seen on streets. In TV address, Putin calls Wagner challenge "high treason"

Voronezh: Wagner fighters reportedly seize military sites

M4: Army helicopters fire at armed Wagner column moving north
