

Spain's right on verge of election majority

Final opinion polls show the right-wing People's Party ahead of the ruling Socialists, but needing the support of far-right Vox to govern



Socialist Party (PSOE)

Centre-left party of Prime Minister **Pedro Sánchez**. Has governed with far-left UP alliance (now Sumar) since 2019



Pledges: Help with rising mortgage costs, raise minimum wage and give under-24s free transport

People's Party (PP)

Centre-right party of **Alberto Núñez Feijóo** (right). PP last held power from 2011-2018 under premiership of **Mariano Rajoy**



Pledges: Streamline tax system, cut taxes for lower-income earners, scrap wealth tax and boost industry



Sumar (Unite)

Far-left/green coalition under **Yolanda Díaz**. Hopes Socialists will win enough votes to keep PP and Vox out of power



Pledges: Introduce 32-hour week, provide mortgage subsidies and boost funding for medical expenses

Vox

Far-right party led by **Santiago Abascal**. Party campaigns against feminism, immigration, LGBT rights and Islam




Pledges: Simplify income tax, reduce graft, cut public spending and increase tax breaks for large families


SPAIN ELECTION POLLS VS 2019 BALLOT
