

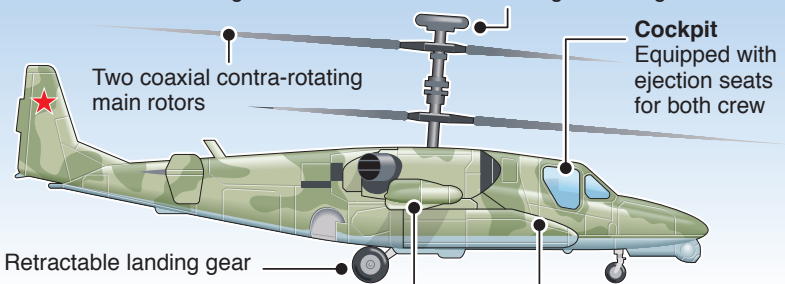
Russia's Ka-52 attack helicopter

The Kamov Ka-52 attack helicopter is proving to be a formidable adversary as the Ukrainian army continues its counteroffensive against Russian forces

KAMOV KA-52 ALLIGATOR: Attack helicopter entered service in 2011

Powerplant: Two 2,400hp Klimov VK-2500 turboshaft engines

Mast-mounted radar: Two antennas for aerial and ground targets



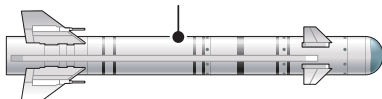
Stub wings: Six hardpoints can carry anti-tank missiles, unguided rockets and anti-aircraft missiles
