▲ **Spanish teenager Carlos Alcaraz won his first Grand Slam title at the U.S. Open and became the youngest World No.1 in the history of the ATP rankings**

1948: Muhammad Ali Jinnah, founder of modern Pakistan, died in Karachi at age 71

1952: The first artificial aortic valve, made of Flexiglas, was fitted into the heart of a 30-year-old patient

1973: President Salvador Allende of Chile died in a military coup led by General Augusto Pinochet

2001: Three hijacked aircraft crashed into the twin towers of the World Trade Centre and the Pentagon
