October 3, 1863

▲ Despite the hardship of the Civil War, U.S. President Abraham Lincoln issued a proclamation designating the last Thursday in November as Thanksgiving Day

1941: The aerosol can was invented to enable soldiers in WWII to zap malaria-carrying mosquitoes in the Pacific

1953: Gen. George C. Marshall was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for masterminding Europe's programme of recovery after World War II

1990: East and West Germany were formally reunited as one country

2008: Former American football star O.J. Simpson was convicted of armed robbery and kidnapping
