▲ **Angela Lansbury, a star of the Golden Age of Hollywood but latterly better known for the U.S. TV crime series *Murder, She Wrote*, died aged 96**

1881: Roll film for the first Kodak camera was patented in the U.S.

1919: The first airline meals were served on a flight from London to Paris, costing three shillings

1938: Glass wool, used for insulation, was invented when compressed air accidentally hit a sliver of molten glass

1963: French singer and cabaret star Edith Piaf, whose most famous song is probably *Non, Je Ne Regrette Rien*, died at the age of 47
