▲ The “Black Blizzard” began in South Dakota, sweeping clouds of suffocating topsoil across the U.S. and creating a storm of dirt that heralded the Dust Bowl era

1493: Swiss physician and alchemist Paracelsus, who established the role of chemistry in medicine, was born

1983: U.S. student Fred Cohen demonstrated the working of a computer virus for the first time

1983: Microsoft introduced Windows 1.0 to run graphical programs as well as existing MS-DOS software

2022: Russia abandoned Kherson, the only provincial capital captured during its invasion of Ukraine
