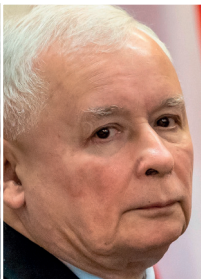


Poland's election earthquake

Despite winning most votes, Poland's incumbent Law and Justice party (PiS) has lost its election majority and Donald Tusk's Civic Coalition will likely form a coalition

Jarosław Kaczyński (left). Right-wing populist **Law and Justice (PiS)** party will first attempt to form government, but has no coalition partners

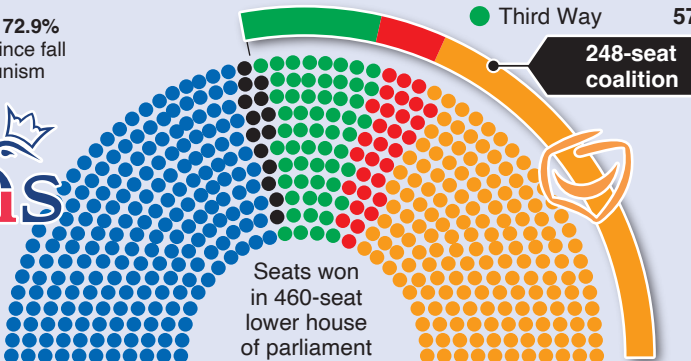
