▲ Oprah Winfrey, U.S. actress and TV host, was born. Her hugely successful talk show reputedly made her the best-paid individual on U.S. television

January 30, 1649

▲ England became a republic when King Charles I was beheaded for treason during the English Civil War. The monarchy was restored in 1660

1933: Adolf Hitler was appointed Chancellor of Germany, paving the way for the Nazis to assume full power.



January 31, 1999

▲ Scientists confirmed a long-held suspicion that the HIV virus, which causes Aids, originated in a subspecies of chimpanzee found in central Africa

1876: The U.S. government ordered all remaining Native Americans to move to reservations or be arrested



February 1, 2014

▲ The Mumbai Monorail, India's first monorail since independence, was officially inaugurated. Around 20,000 people queued to use it on its first day of operation

1536: Buenos Aires was founded by Spanish explorer Pedro de Mendoza


1914: Charlie Chaplin, one of the greatest stars of the silent movie era, made his film debut
