Olympic tennis returns to clay courts for first time since 1992

FORMAT

Knockout tournament contested in men's and women's singles, and men's, women's and mixed doubles



Scoring: Regular tennis scoring. Matches played as best-of-three sets, with tie-break used at six games all

Capacity: 15,000
Retractable roof completed in 2020. Closes in 15 minutes, allowing all-weather play and night sessions

Playing time
Slow surface increases duration of points, testing stamina and physicality

Ball speed
Clay absorbs pace of ball, producing higher bounce with more spin, leading to longer, more tactical rallies

Footwork
Slippery top layer allows players to slide into shots
