

What's in the U.S. Senate security bill

The U.S. Senate has unveiled a long-awaited bipartisan deal that would tighten U.S. border laws and grant new aid for Ukraine and Israel

\$60.1bn

Aid to Ukraine – includes almost **\$20bn** to replenish U.S. weapons and equipment provided to Ukraine and **\$13.8bn** to allow Kyiv to buy more munitions from U.S. suppliers

\$20.2bn

For extra enforcement on U.S.-Mexico border and to combat drug trafficking

\$14.1bn

Security assistance to Israel – includes about **\$5.2bn** for missile defence systems

\$2.44bn

U.S. Central Command and conflict in Red Sea

\$2.33bn

Ukrainian refugees and other displaced persons
