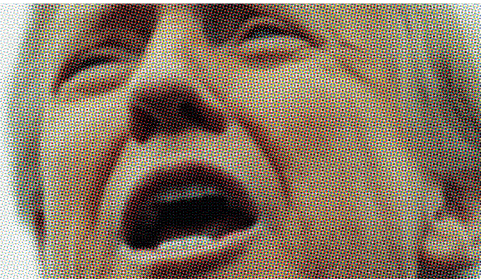


Trump's criminal trials
