

Indonesia's presidential candidates

Three contenders are vying to succeed the incumbent Joko Widodo as leader of the world's third-largest democracy and the most populous Muslim-majority nation



PRABOWO SUBIANTO, 72

- Defence minister and former special forces commander, making third run at presidency after losing to Jokowi in 2014 and 2019

- Commands huge following despite allegations of human rights violations in late 1990s

*Running on joint ticket with vice-presidential candidate **Gibran Rakabuming Raka**, Widodo's eldest son (right)*



ANIES BASWEDAN, 54

- Former academic and governor of Jakarta (2017-22), is climbing in polls with anti-establishment message that includes opposing costly capital move to Borneo

- Accused of stoking religious divides during 2017 campaign for governor, he has now picked **Muhaimin Iskandar**, head of largest Islamic party, which has strong ties with country's largest moderate Muslim organisation as running mate

GANJAR PRANOWO, 55

- Two-time governor of populous Central Java province, has huge support from ordinary Indonesians as leader from outside of political and military elite

- Bid to succeed popular Widodo – who is member of same **PDI-P** party – dented by Widodo's move to tacitly support rival, Subianto
