▲ **Moscow replaced Petrograd as the new capital of Russia, with the Kremlin once again becoming the seat of political power under the new Soviet government**

1930: American food scientist Clarence Birdseye developed the quick-freeze technique

1936: The Spitfire, Britain's most strategically important single-seat fighter of WWII, was unveiled

1970: The Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty came into force

1984: Scientists warned that the increased production of carbon dioxide was heating up the earth's atmosphere
