▲ **The Rolling Stones, the first album by the group of the same name, was released. It became a big international hit, and topped the UK charts for 12 weeks**

1922: In the U.S. the manufacture of beer or wine in the home was outlawed

1943: Swiss chemist **Albert Hofman** discovered the **psychedelic properties of LSD**

1947: The phrase “Cold War” was coined to describe the deteriorating relationship between the U.S. and the Soviet Union

2003: The **World Health Organisation** confirmed a new coronavirus had caused the global **SARS epidemic**
