



History of the Henri Delaunay Cup

Named in honour of *Henri Delaunay*, the first General Secretary of UEFA who first proposed a pan-European Championship. Delaunay died in 1955, five years before the inaugural tournament



ORIGINAL TROPHY: 1960-2004

◀ Designed by **Pierre Delaunay**, Henri's son, and made by **Chobillon** goldsmiths. Trophy later bought by Paris jeweller **Arthus Bertrand**

◆ Design bears words *Championnat d'Europe* on front and juggling boy on reverse

NEW TROPHY: 2008-present

◆ Remodelled by renowned silversmiths **Asprey of London**. Sterling silver, 18cm taller and 2kg heavier than original, to reflect scale of Europe's most prestigious championships



Iker Casillas is first captain to lift new trophy, as Spain beat Germany in Vienna

◆ Tournament celebrates 60th anniversary in 2020, with matches hosted across Europe

◆ Trophy remains in UEFA's possession – winners receive full-size replica. Team winning three successive titles, or five in total, receives special recognition
