1994: One of the world's largest cargo aircraft, the Beluga, was unveiled



June 25, 2009

▲ According to legend, the Pied Piper lured 130 children from the German town of Hamelin, allegedly in revenge for not being paid for clearing the town of rats

June 27, 1967

▲ The world's first electronic cash dispensing machine was installed in London. The advent of the ATM, or automated teller machine, transformed banking worldwide

1844: Joseph Smith, founder of the Mormon Church, was killed by a mob storming a jail in Carthage, Illinois

1905: Mutinous Russian sailors took control of the battleship Potemkin and threw the commander overboard

1954: The world's first atomic power station opened in the "Science City" of Obninsk, near Moscow

2023: Riots broke out across France after a youth of North African descent was shot dead by police

June 28, 1914

▲ Archduke Franz Ferdinand, heir to the Austro-Hungarian throne, and his wife were assassinated by a Serb nationalist in Sarajevo, an event that triggered World War I

1935: U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt ordered a federal gold vault to be built at Fort Knox

1939: Pan American Airways inaugurated a regular transatlantic air service

1967: Worshippers were permitted to return to the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem after the Six-Day War

1995: Madhya Pradesh in India was designated as the "Tiger State" to protect the animal from poachers
