

Lyles wins historic 100m showdown

At the Paris Olympics, U.S. sprinter *Noah Lyles* stormed to the 100m gold by just five-thousandths of a second, ahead of *Kishane Thompson* of Jamaica. All eight men achieved sub-10-second times, making it the fastest race in history

Lyles hit top speed of 43.6km/h at 60m to contend for medal – closing race better than rivals

All eight men finished within 0.12secs of claiming gold. Jamaica's **Oblique Seville** finished 8th with time of 9.91secs – enough to secure 4th at Tokyo 2020
