

Iran ships “hundreds” of missiles to Russia

Iran has reportedly sent more than 200 Fath-360 ballistic missiles to Russia in what Kyiv officials said marks a “serious escalation” of Tehran’s support for Moscow’s invasion of Ukraine

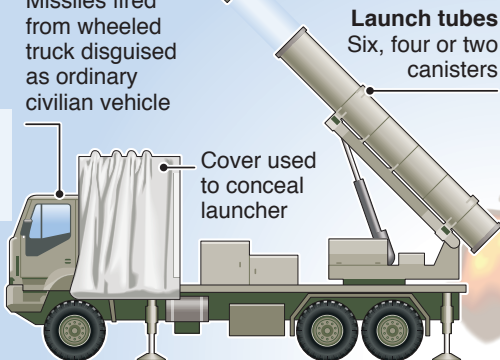
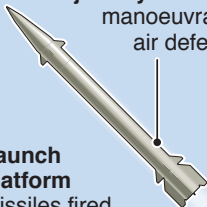
Trajectory: Missile is relatively small and manoeuvrable, making it harder for air defence systems to intercept

Mobility: System can be quickly repositioned after firing, enhancing its survivability in combat scenarios

Launch tubes
Six, four or two
canisters

Launch platform
Missiles fired from wheeled truck disguised as ordinary civilian vehicle

Cover used to conceal launcher



What targets could Russia strike using Fath-360 missiles?

■ Ukrainian infrastructure and cities close to Russian border, such as Kharkiv and Sumy

■ Troop positions and military targets along front line, including around strategic eastern city of Pokrovsk
