Hush Money Case (New York)

■ **Apr 15, 2024:** Criminal trial starts

■ **Charges:** Unanimous 12-person jury finds Trump guilty of 34 felony counts of violating New York law on corporate record-keeping to hide \$130,000 hush-money payment to adult-film star **Stormy Daniels** ahead of 2016 election. **Trump claims payment as legal expense**

■ **May 30:** Trump is first U.S. president to become convicted felon

■ **Jul 11, 2024:** Trump's attorneys vow to appeal verdict

■ **Next steps:** Sentencing postponed until Nov 26, after election

Federal Election Fraud Case (District of Columbia)

■ **Charges:** Trump pleads not guilty to four federal felony charges issued in Aug 2023 by Washington DC grand jury for his attempt to overturn results of 2020 election

Georgia Election Fraud Case

■ **Charges:** Trump and 18 co-defendants are charged with conspiracy to overturn **Joe Biden's** win in Georgia, and promoting corrupt plan to win state's 16 Electoral College votes by appointing fake electors

Classified Documents Case (New York)

■ **Charges:** Considered by many lawyers to be strongest criminal case against Trump.

Trump faces 40 federal charges that he illegally concealed classified and top-secret documents at his Mar-a-Lago resort from investigators

■ **Jul 15, 2024:** District Judge **Aileen Cannon** – who was nominated to bench by Trump – cancels trial, ruling that Special Counsel Smith was improperly appointed

■ **Next steps:** Special Counsel Smith asks 11th Circuit Court of Appeals to overturn Judge Cannon's dismissal
