▲ **Entrepreneur Sam Bankman-Fried was convicted of fraud and money laundering over his role in the bankruptcy of cryptocurrency exchange FTX**

1917: The Balfour Declaration proclaimed British support for the “establishment in Palestine of a national home for the Jewish people”

1959: The first stretch of the M1, Britain’s first motorway, opened, initially with no speed limits

1964: King Saud of Saudi Arabia abdicated in favour of his brother, Crown Prince Faisal

1988: A U.S. student released the first significant computer “worm”
