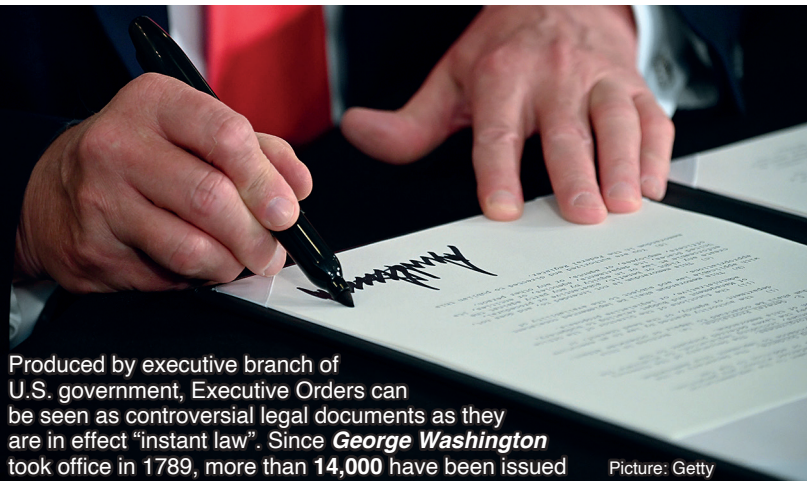


Who's signed the most Executive Orders?

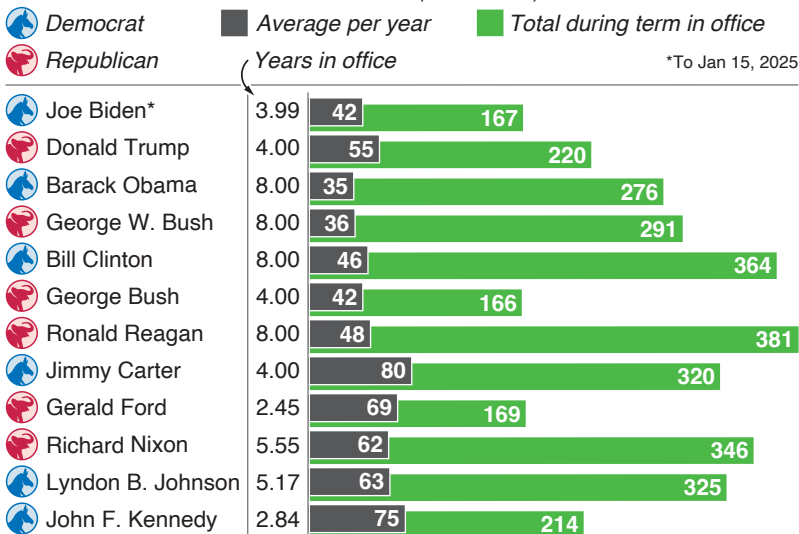
As one of the most common presidential documents in the U.S. government, an *Executive Order* is a signed directive from the president that requires no approval from Congress



Produced by executive branch of U.S. government, Executive Orders can be seen as controversial legal documents as they are in effect "instant law". Since **George Washington** took office in 1789, more than **14,000** have been issued
