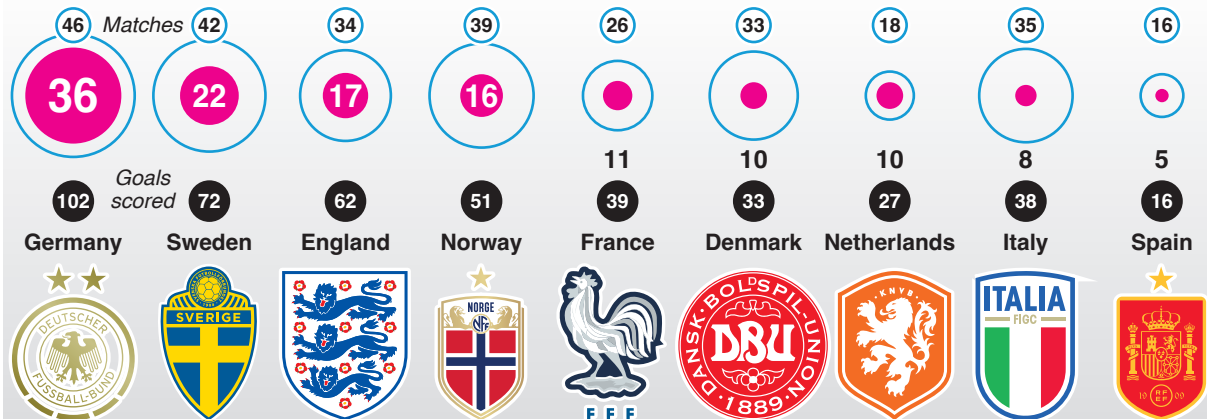
WINNERS AND FINALISTS

Only five different teams have won the trophy since the first championship in 1984 – England are defending champions, while Germany are aiming to take the title for a record-extending ninth time
