

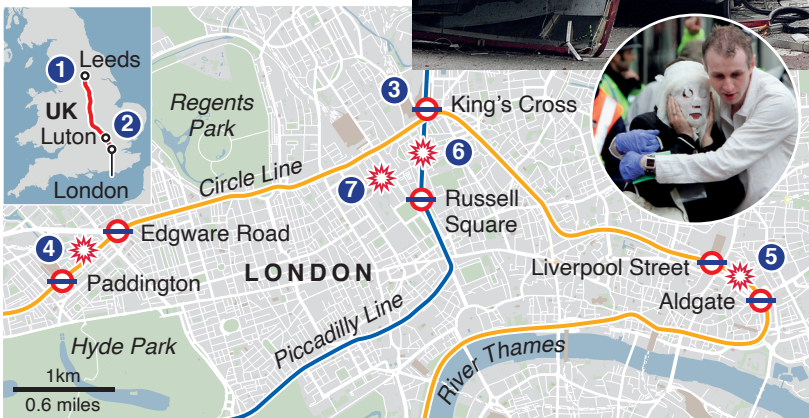
# 7/7 London bombing remembered

Twenty years ago, at the end of a July morning rush hour, London was rocked by the worst single terrorist attack on British soil. More than 50 people lost their lives, with hundreds more left injured

**1 Jul 7, 2005. 04:00 local time:** Three bombers – ringleader **Mohammad Sidique Khan**, **Shehzad Tanweer** and **Hasib Hussain** – leave Leeds in rented car

**2 06:51-07:24:** Trio meet fourth accomplice, **Germaine Lindsay**, at Luton before heading to London by train

**3 08:23:** Bombers arrive at King's Cross station and split up, boarding east- and westbound Tube trains. Twenty minutes later, simultaneous explosions strike carriages



**4** Khan detonates device on Circle Line train between Edgware Road and Paddington.  
**6 killed, +160 injured**

**5** Tanweer detonates bomb on Circle Line train between Liverpool Street and Aldgate. **7 killed, +170 injured**

**6** Lindsay detonates device on Piccadilly Line train between King's Cross and Russell Square.  
**26 killed, +340 injured**

**7 09:47:** Hussain detonates bomb on double-decker bus in Tavistock Square. **13 killed, +100 injured**

■ **7/7 bombing, perpetrated by “ordinary British citizens” using cheap, easily obtainable materials, triggered major shift in UK counterterrorism policy towards addressing domestic threats**
