

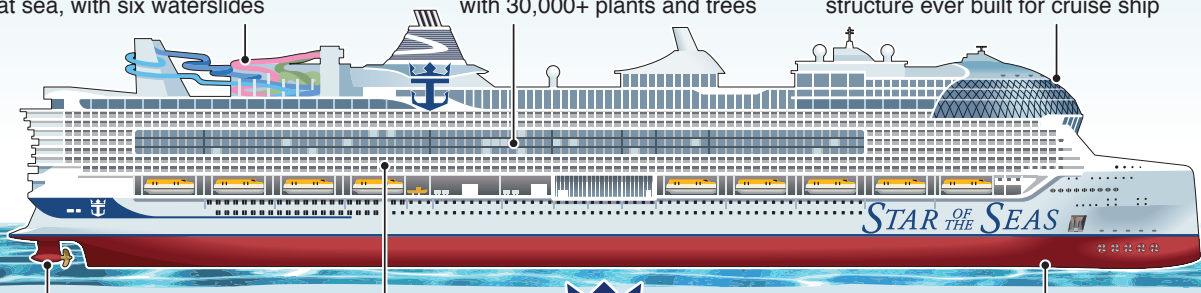
Mammoth cruise ship sets sail

Royal Caribbean's *Star of the Seas* is the newest addition to the Icon class and the world's largest cruise ship, alongside her sister vessel, *Icon of the Seas*

Thrill Island: Hosts largest waterpark at sea, with six waterslides

Central Park: Open-air space with 30,000+ plants and trees

AquaDome: Largest glass and steel structure ever built for cruise ship



Propulsion: Three azipod thrusters and six dual-fuel engines with ability to use diesel or liquefied natural gas (LNG)

Accommodation: 2,805 staterooms in 28 grades. Total occupancy of 7,600 guests using all berths



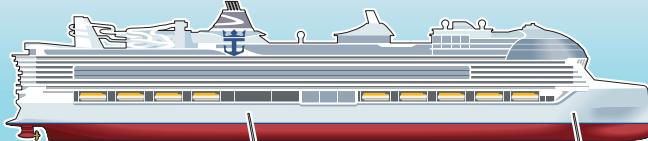
