

Thailand-Cambodia truce holding

Thailand and Cambodia have agreed to halt their deadliest conflict in more than a decade following five days of clashes between the Southeast Asian neighbours

Fighting has killed at least 40 people and displaced over 300,000 in both countries



TIMELINE OF TENSIONS

- **1907:** French colony of Cambodia and Kingdom of Siam (now Thailand) sign treaty delineating border, but map's vagueness causes ambiguity
- **2008-11:** Fighting breaks out intermittently
- **2011:** Troops clash around **Preah Vihear Temple (1)**, killing at least 15 people
- **May 28, 2025:** Cambodian soldier killed during skirmish in **Chong Bok (2)**
- **Jul 23:** Five Thai soldiers injured in landmine explosion near **Chong An Ma (3)**
- **Jul 24:** Fighting erupts near **Prasat Ta Muen Thom Temple (4)** and quickly escalates to heavy fighting in multiple areas along border
- **Jul 28:** Both sides agree to "immediate and unconditional ceasefire" following peace talks
- **Jul 29:** Thai and Cambodian military commanders meet, as shaky truce appears to hold
