

Nicolas Sarkozy goes to prison

Sarkozy, the first French post-war leader and first former head of an EU country to go to jail, will enter La Santé – the historic Paris prison that has housed some of France's most notorious inmates



Sarkozy, 70: President from 2007-12, sentenced to five years in jail for criminal conspiracy over scheme to secure campaign funds from late Libyan dictator **Muammar Gaddafi**

■ “VIP WING”:

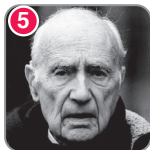
Sarkozy likely to occupy cell in wing for “vulnerable people” on upper floor of **Quartier Bas**



■ Each cell, measuring 9-12 sq m, comes with cooking hob, fridge, TV, shower, toilet and fixed phone for approved calls

■ He will have one hour of solitary exercise each day and be allowed three visits per week
