- Commands security forces
- Controls foreign affairs and conducts negotiations with Israel
- Signs or vetoes legislation passed by parliament
- Appoints or dismisses prime minister
 but only with approval of parliament

Recently acquired powers

Controls Palestinian
Broadcasting Corp. – which
runs Palestine TV and Voice
of Palestine radio station

PBC
Appoints constitutional
court which takes final decision
in disputes with prime minister.


Court could block a Hamas

effort to impose Islamic law

- Appoints Cabinet ministers
- Drafts policy, oversees ministries
- Handles day-to-day contacts with Israel on civilian matters

PARLIAMENT

- Approves budget and ratifies laws presented by Cabinet
- No-confidence vote with absolute majority can bring down government



Despite absolute majority, Hamas falls short of two-thirds majority needed to override an Abbas veto on legislation
