400th anniversary of Rembrandt's birth

Rembrandt van Rijn, the greatest painter of the Dutch golden age, was born 400 years ago this month. In a prolific career Rembrandt produced over 600 paintings, 300 etchings, and 2,000 drawings, including over 80 self-portraits, but his personal life was blighted by tragedy



1606 Born July 15 in Leiden, ninth of 10 children of a miller and his wife 1620 Enrolled at University of

Leiden but never begins studies 1620-23 Apprenticed to painter

Jacob van Swanenburgh

1625-26 Studies for six months with Pieter Lastman in Amsterdam before setting up studio in Leiden 1628 Work admired by royal court

- important commissions follow 1632 Moves to Amsterdam house of art dealer Hendrick Uylenburgh. Paints first group portrait, Anatomy Lesson of Dr. Nicolaes Tulp

1634 Marries Hendrick's niece. Saskia van Uylenburgh

1639 Buys house in Amsterdam for vast sum of 13,000 guilders

1641 Son Titus born - three earlier babies all died in infancy

1642 Completes The Night Watch (detail, right), Saskia dies

1654 Rembrandt's mistress

Hendrickje Stoffels gives birth to his daughter, Cornelia



declared bankrupt

1663 Hendrickje dies from plague 1666 Rembrandt paints *The*

Jewish Bride (left) 1668 Titus dies from plaque

1669 Rembrandt dies October 4, and is buried in obscure rented grave
