



Israel's onslaught on Lebanon

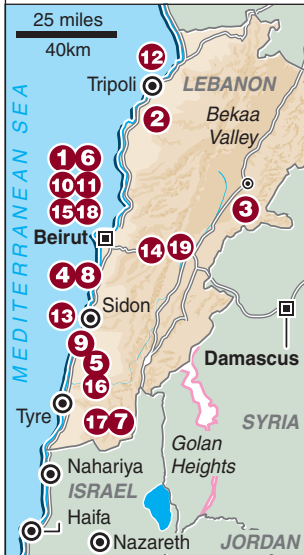
Lebanese Prime Minister *Fouad Siniora* is outraged at Lebanon's destruction and wants compensation from Israel. Reconstruction costs are estimated at more than \$2 billion, with a further \$2.5 billion in lost tourism revenue

AIRPORTS

1. Beirut: Runways bombed, fuel tanks destroyed; **2. Qulayaat:** Badly damaged; **3. Rayaq:** Military airport severely damaged



ELECTRICITY

4. Jiyeh: Power station hit; **5. Siblin:** Power generator hit; **6. Beirut:** Power cuts for six hours a day; **7. South:** 750,000 people without electricity



FUEL

8. Jiyeh: Oil storage tanks destroyed – supplies sufficient for two-three weeks. 17 fuel stores and 12 petrol stations destroyed around country



WATER

9. Dair al-Zahrani: Treatment plant hit; **10. Ashrafiyeh:** Two water drilling trucks destroyed



PORTS

11. Beirut: Grain silos hit, lighthouse out of action; **12. Tripoli:** Maritime operations antenna hit; **13. Sidon:** Port attacked



TRANSPORT

14. Road to Damascus and 37 other key highways severely damaged; 55 bridges destroyed



INDUSTRY

15. Beirut: Paper mill damaged, TransMed food warehouse totally destroyed



MEDICAL

16. Nabatiyeh: Hospital bombed; **17. Mayss al-Jabal:** Hospital destroyed; **18: Beirut:** Medical supplies company hit; **19: Zahle:** UAE Red Crescent medical convoy aid attacked



HUMAN COST

Lebanese: At least 330 killed, mostly civilians – one third reportedly children. **Israelis:** 31 killed, including 15 civilians – victims of some 900 Hezbollah rockets that hit Israel in past week. **Displaced people:** 500,000, of which 150,000 have fled to Syria. 13,000 foreign nationals evacuated
