Ryder Cup match format

Players compete simply for the honour of winning golf's most prestigious team event, the Ryder Cup. Using the matchplay format, matches are scored hole-by-hole in a series of fourball, foursome, and singles contests

Matches Play format

FOURBALL: Four groups of 2 two-man teams. One ball per player. *Team of player* with lowest score wins hole Points won since 1979*



1pt for each win, 1/2pt for tied match

FOURSOME: Four pairings of 2 two-man teams. One ball per team – players take alternate shots, taking turns to tee-off.

Team with lowest score wins hole

SINGLES: Two players from opposing teams. *Player* with lowest score wins hole

TOTAL: Minimum 141/2 points needed to win tournament. If scores are tied at 14 points, Europe will retain title
